A Stewardship Letter to the Congregation

As in Pastor Jeff's sermon on Nov. 13th regarding Jesus' parable of the talents. The master goes on a journey and entrusts his property to his servants. To the one he gave 5 talents (over \$5000), to another 2 talents, and to another 1 talent, each according to his ability.

It is made clear that upon the master's return he expected a return on his investment. You can find out more of what happened in Matthew 25: verses 14.....

How do you feel about what the Bible says in versus 26 to 30? I myself find the words scary and ominous.

What then should I take from this parable? I know that God has expectations of me – that He is expecting a return on His investment in me. He is expecting a return from me on the talents (in the broader sense, not just monetary) that I have been given.

So the difference between the two servants who invested what the master entrusted to them and the one who buried his one talent comes down to their image of the master. Those who have a positive image of the master will be motivated to do his will (the "cheerful giver"). The one who does not have a positive image of the master will be the "fearful hoarder".

Almost anything that can be purchased in a store can be purchased at the online store through Amazon. It is an excellent alternative to a Visa card.

Ask The Weatherman

How did the hurricane season turn out? The 2011 Atlantic hurricane season is a very active season that began on June 1 and will end on November 30. The last hurricane was Rina in the western Caribbean, 23-28 October, and the last tropical storm was Sean near Bermuda in November. Despite the 19 tropical cyclones that developed this season, only 6 storms became hurricanes. The 3 major hurricanes include Irene, Katia, and Phillippe. Irene was the only hurricane to impact the United States with major damage from North Carolina up the Atlantic Coast into the Northeast States. Fortunately, the state of Florida was again missed this year by any hurricanes or tropical storms.

How much rain was there in October? Rainfall varied greatly across Florida, dry in the north and wet in the south. The total of 0.24 inches in Pensacola was 5 inches below normal, making October 2011 the 8th driest October on record. In contrast, two separate heavy rain events in the southern part of the state helped ease drought conditions and broke many records. The monthly total of 17.14 inches at Key West makes it the 2nd wettest October on record, only behind October 1969 with 21.57 inches. Orlando with 8.87 inches and Miami with 15.52 inches saw their 3rd and 5th, respectively, wettest Octobers on record. Some heavy October totals include Vero Beach with 21.93 inches, 447 percent of normal, and Marathon with 20.34 inches, 426 percent of normal. Locally, October rainfall included 2.76 inches at Parrish, 82 percent of normal, and 1.80 inches at the Sarasota-Bradenton Airport, 58 percent of normal.

Were there some unusual heavy rain events in South Florida? The largest totals occurred October 15-19 due to a slow-moving subtropical low pressure system that initially stalled over Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula and then traversed the eastern Gulf of Mexico. Five-day totals in the Lower Keys include 15.21 inches at Key West and 21.24 inches at Big Coppitt Key. Moisture from Hurricane Rina produced beneficial heavy rains in South Florida on October 28-31 with 9.83 inches at Pompano Beach, 7.25 inches at Fort Lauderdale, and 6.35 inches at West Palm Beach.

What is the drought situation in Florida? Our long-term drought has diminished over the Peninsula. Only the Panhandle and portions of North Florida continue to experience long-term drought with 37 percent under abnormally dry conditions, 20 percent under a severe drought, and 8 percent under an extreme drought. So far in 2011, every month has been drier than normal in Tallahassee. Rainfall for the first 10 months of 2011 measured only 29.48 inches in Tallahassee which was 22.35 inches below normal. The only drier year on record for the first 10 months was 1954 with 27.98 inches.

When does winter officially start this year? Winter arrives in 2011 with the winter solstice on December 22 at 12:30 AM EST. The December solstice occurs when the North Pole is tilted 23.5 degrees away from the sun. The sun is directly overhead on the Tropic of Capricorn in the southern hemisphere during the December solstice. In the northern hemisphere, the December solstice marks the day of the year with the least hours of daylight north of the Tropic of Cancer. There will be no sun visible north of the Arctic Circle. If you are south of the Antarctic Circle, there will be 24 hours of daylight.
